1. Plenary / Large audience

- **Main Lecture** (Plenary Session)

A formal oral presentation in the main lecture hall, addressed to all participants.

- **Panel Presentation** (Thematic Panel)

A coordinated contribution as part of a panel with other presenters on a shared topic or question, with a chairperson and space for discussion.

2. Parallel / Small group sessions

- **Seminar / Workshop**

An interactive session in a small group, focusing on a specific topic and clinical or professional experience, with time for discussion and questions.

- **Oral Presentation in Small Group**

A shorter oral presentation in a parallel session with other presenters, followed by a brief discussion.

3. Poster

- **Poster Presentation**

A visual presentation (printed poster) discussed with participants during dedicated poster sessions.

- **Language:** All abstracts must be submitted in English.
- **Font:** Arial, 11 pt (except for the title).
- **Spacing:** Single line spacing.
- **File Format:** Save and upload this file as a **PDF** (not docx or other formats)
- **File Size Limit:** 2MB per file

- **File Naming:** Please name your file with the surname and name of the first author as follows: SURNAME_Name_IAIP2027.pdf

Ensure your pdf is text-based (not a scanned image) for accessibility.
